A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

Update on a few 'issues' that continue to provide a source of aggravation.

Lack of Parking: this is an ongoing issue and as the Club continues to grow and the traffic congestion at the end of some of the more popular activities increases, we need to be patient when exiting the carpark.
